

TO REPLACE BATTERIES




WARNING:

(For first time playing)

- 1. Pull out insulation tag as Fig 1.
- 2. Press on roof for lights and sounds.



REPLACING BATTERIES

3 x AG13(1.5V) BATTERIES INCLUDED

- · Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard(carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
