(B) Fantastic painting fun for children.

Tools, accessories:

Marabu Primar Paint is quickly and easily applied with the fingers, a brush (we recommend soft synthetic brushes), a small sponge or spatula. Many different objects increase the creative use of the paint, such as toothbrushes, wooden sticks, plastic combs, or stamps.

Substrates:

Ideal for paper, board, glass and film.

Properties:

Marabu Primar Paint is water-soluble and so wipe-proof only, not waterproof. The paint is ready-to-use and does not need to be thinned. Because of its special consistency, the colours do not run into each other. Therefore Primar Paint is versatile and offers a variety of creative possibilities for use.

Removing Primar Paint:

Primar Paint can be easily washed out with cold water, wiped off and removed. Colour stains on textiles should be pre-treated with detergent and soaked in cold water before washing.

Here are some creative techniques with Primar Paint:

Scratch technique:

- Paint the whole paper with different colours using a soft brush
- Allow this base to dry
- Then paint another coat with Primar Paint black covering the whole area
- Scratch shapes or patterns into the wet black paint using a painting spatula, tooth pick, comb or other object
- The coloured paint is visible under the scratched off areas

Butterfly/folding and symmetry technique:

- Fold the paper or transparent film in the middle and open again
- Drip thick blobs of paint onto one half of the paper
- Fold the paper or film together again
- Spread the paint from the fold to the outer edges of the folded paper
- Open the paper or film immediately again
- This creates imaginative mirror images

Transparent glass pictures:

- Paint Marabu Primar Paint directly onto glass (e.g. window pane)
- The paint is also ideal for stamping (e.g. with potatoes shapes, sponges, rubber-sponge shapes or blown balloons)
- This makes colourful and transparent window pictures
- Paint can be easily wiped off with cold, soapy water

Marbling:

- Apply 2, maximum 3, different colours onto cardboard or paper in one go
- Then turn the cardboard or paper in all directions, shake and tap the sheet on the table

Drawing technique with spatula:

- Drip 5 thick blobs of paint onto the bottom left of the paper using different colours (e.g. rainbow)
- Make these blobs into a bow or other shape in one go using a broad spatula (e.g. blunt knife or firm cardboard)

Marble technique:

- Put some paper into an open cardboard box
- Dribble 2-3 different Marabu Primar Paint colours over the whole paper
- Then roll some marbles around inside the box
- This makes lovely free patterns
