

You will also require: smooth work surface (glass or ceramic), metal pots, Pattex MULTI all-purpose glue



Begin by making two approx. 3 mm thick sheets out of indian red and sun flower FIMO using the acrylic roller or FIMO clay machine.

The sheets should be nice and even.

Place the sheets on top of each other and cut the edges straight. Now roll out again to make it thinner, until the double sheet is around 3 mm thick again.

Using the peppermint FIMO, make an approx. 1 cm thick sausage and cut it so that it is the same length as the width of the sheet.


Tip:

Unfinished items and left-over bits of material can be stored in a sealed plastic bag or airtight container, e.g. a plastic box or jar.

Now, roll the sausage up in the sheet. This makes a snail shell pattern in the cross-section.



Then, roll out two more sheets – this time using peppermint and windsor blue FIMO. Like before, make an approx. 1 cm thick and 5 cm long sausage using white FIMO.



Next, wrap the peppermint-coloured sheet around the white FIMO sausage. Contrary to the red-coloured cane you made before, you need to make sure this time that the sheet does not overlap at the join – otherwise the pattern will be distorted.

Carefully smooth over the join using your fingers. Repeat the procedure with the sheet of windsor blue FIMO.

With these techniques and a little imagination, you can make lots of different pattern canes.

Different diameters are created by cutting a piece off the cane and rolling it to make it thinner.

Now, using the thin blade, cut lots of approx. 2 mm thick slices off the pattern canes and harden them for 30 minutes in the oven at 110°C.

After cooling, add a coat of gloss varnish to one side of the slices and leave to dry thoroughly. Finally, with the shiny side on the outside, stick the slices to the metal pot using Pattex MULTI all-purpose glue.
